



MSC's Help, Hope, Change Award

MSC's Help, Hope, Change Award (HHC) celebrates a community leader or corporation that exemplifies the mission of MSC to provide pathways out of poverty for our neighbors. The award is presented annually at the MSC Helps Luncheon in October with the inaugural award in 2019.

Nominee Eligibility:

1. Nominee lives, works, or makes an impact within MSC's service area of South King County.
2. Nominee has made significant contributions to helping our neighbors living in poverty to find help, hope, and dignity. This could include but is not limited to policy change work, direct service to those living in poverty, or significant contributions to support MSC and/or other organizations working with those living in poverty.
3. Nominee is willing to receive award and attend luncheon in October to accept award in person.
4. Current MSC board members and staff are not eligible for the HHC award.
5. Nominee can be an individual, corporation, or organization.

Nomination and Award Selection Process:

1. Nominations will be accepted starting the first week of January each year and through the end of March with the exception of the inaugural HHC award.
2. Nominations must be made through a formal nomination application process with the exception of the inaugural HHC award.
3. Applications will be reviewed by MSC's CEO and Development Director to ensure that the nominee meets the eligibility requirements.
4. Nominee applications that meet the eligibility requirements will be forwarded to the Fund Development Committee of the MSC Board of Directors. This committee will select the winner annually in April, along with two alternate runner-ups.
5. The nominee will be alerted of their selection and confirm that they are willing to accept and attend the Luncheon in October.
6. If the nominee is unwilling to accept the award, the first runner-up will be contacted. If the first runner-up is not willing to accept, the second runner-up will be contacted.

Criteria Considered by Committee for Award:

1. Specific examples of contributions to help community members in need are included in nomination.
2. Perception and/or proof of impact of nominee's commitment to helping community members living in poverty become self-sufficient.
3. Nominees embrace and/or represent the diversity in our community.
4. Geographic location of nominee to ensure that entire South King County region that MSC serves is represented in awardees.
