Food is offered in a market style inside the Food Bank, Please bring boxes or bags to carry your food once you leave the Food Bank.

- Households may visit the Food Bank once a week.
- Please do not arrive early, food items are available and restocked throughout the market timeframe.
- Entry is only available through the front of the building.
- Some programs have specifications that may exclude those that are not residents within the Federal Way Public School District area.
